Councilmember Phil Mendelson, Chairperson of the Committee on Public Safety and the Judiciary, announces a public hearing on PR 18-629, District of Columbia Office of Administrative Hearings Mary Oates Walker Confirmation. The public hearing will be held at 12:00 p.m. on Friday, January 15, 2010 in Hearing Room 412 of the John A. Wilson Building.

The stated purpose of PR 18-629 is to confirm the appointment to a six year term of Mary Oats Walker as the Chief Administrative Law Judge for the Office of Administrative Hearings. The Office of Administrative Hearings is an independent administrative tribunal that hears administrative litigation involving over 25 different agencies, boards and commissions of the District of Columbia. The purpose of this hearing is to receive testimony from government and public witnesses as to the fitness of this nominee to the position of Chief Administrative Law Judge.

Witnesses should limit their testimony to five minutes; less time will be allowed if there are a large number of witnesses.

If you are unable to testify at the hearing, written statements are encouraged and will be made a part of the official record. Washington, D.C. 20004. The record will close at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, January 25, 2010.
