**ORDER DENYING MOTION FOR CLARIFICATION**



**LONG, COMMISSIONER.** On April 23, 2003, the tenant filed a “Motion for Clarification (Justification of Death of the Disabled).” The tenant asked the “Commission to clarify whether it supports the policy of the D.C. Courts that justifies causing the death of disabled parties if the case load of the tribunal is heavy or if the tribunal views the disabled individual as an inconvenience or nuisance.” This policy, which the tenant attributes to the court, was derived from the tenant’s interpretation of events surrounding the death of a man who became ill in the Superior Court of the District of Columbia.

The Commission does “not ... issue generalized edicts. Rather, [it] decide[s] concrete controversies.” Mims v. Mims, 635 A.2d 320, 326 (D.C. 1993). Accordingly,

the Commission denies, without further comment, the tenant's motion for clarification.
