### FINAL ORDER

On September 25, 2009, Tenant/Petitioner Roger Robinson filed tenant petition (TP) 29,723 alleging violations of the Rental Housing Act of 1985. On May 17, 2010, Tenant, through his counsel, filed a motion for voluntary dismissal of the tenant petition.

The rules of this administrative court provide that a petitioner may file a summary motion for voluntary dismissal of any action and that the presiding judge may grant the motion without awaiting a response from the Respondent. OAH Rule 2817.1. The rules further provide that unless otherwise stipulated by the parties or otherwise provided by statute, a voluntary dismissal shall be without prejudice. OAH Rule 2517.4. Accordingly, the tenant petition is dismissed without prejudice. The hearing scheduled for May 18, 2010, is cancelled, *nunc pro tunc*.

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ORDERED, that Tenants' motion for voluntary dismissal is hereby GRANTED; and it is further

ORDERED, that tenant petition 29,723 is hereby DISMISSED WITHOUT PREJUDICE; and it is further

ORDERED, that the hearing scheduled for May 18, 2010, is CANCELLED, nunc pro tunc; and it is further

**ORDERED**, that the reconsideration and appeal rights of any party aggrieved by this Order are set forth below.

## MOTIONS FOR RECONSIDERATION

Any party served with a final order may file a motion for reconsideration within ten (10) days of service of the final order in accordance with 1 DCMR 2937. When the final order is served by mail, five (5) days are added to the 10 day period in accordance with 1 DCMR 2811.5.

A motion for reconsideration shall be granted only if there has been an intervening change in the law; if new evidence has been discovered that previously was not reasonably available to the party seeking reconsideration; if there is a clear error of law in the final order; if the final order contains typographical, numerical, or technical errors; or if a party shows that there was a good reason for not attending the hearing.

The Administrative Law Judge has thirty (30) days to decide a motion for reconsideration. If a timely motion for reconsideration of a final order is filed, the time to appeal shall not begin to run until the motion for reconsideration is decided or denied by operation of law. If the Judge has not ruled on the motion for reconsideration and 30 days have passed, the motion is automatically denied and the 10 day period for filing an appeal to the Rental Housing Commission begins to run.

### APPEAL RIGHTS

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code §§ 2-1831.16(b) and 42-3502.16(h), any party aggrieved by a Final Order issued by the Office of Administrative Hearings may appeal the Final Order to the District of Columbia Rental Housing Commission within ten (10) business days after service of the final order, in accordance with the Commission's rule, 14 DCMR 3802. If the Final Order is served on the parties by mail, an additional three (3) days shall be allowed, in accordance with 14 DCMR 3802.2.
